# Living in Christ

# Paul's Purpose in 2 Corinthians

- Addressing the relationship between suffering and the power of the Spirit in the Christian life and message.
- Responding to those who believe Paul had suffered too much to be a Spirit-filled apostle.
- 2 Corinthians 4:7 But we have this treasure in jars of clay, to show that the surpassing power belongs to God and not to us.

## 2Corinthians 5:11-21

11 Therefore, knowing the fear of the Lord, we persuade others. But what we are is known to God, and I hope it is known also to your conscience. 12 We are not commending ourselves to you again but giving you cause to boast about us, so that you may be able to answer those who boast about outward appearance and not about what is in the heart. 13 For if we are beside ourselves, it is for God; if we are in our right mind, it is for you.

## 2Corinthians 5:11-21

14 For the love of Christ controls us, because we have concluded this: that one has died for all, therefore all have died; 15 and he died for all, that those who live might no longer live for themselves but for him who for their sake died and was raised. 16 From now on, therefore, we regard no one according to the flesh. Even though we once regarded Christ according to the flesh, we regard him thus no longer.

# In Christ We Are Controlled by His Love

14 For **the love of Christ controls us**, because we have concluded this: that one has died for all, therefore all have died; 15 and he died for all, that **those who live might no longer live for themselves** but for him who for their sake died and was raised. (2 Cor 5:14-15)

Christ's love controls us: restraint or compulsion...

# In Christ We Are a New Creation

16 From now on, therefore, we regard no one according to the flesh. Even though we once regarded Christ according to the flesh, we regard him thus no longer. 17 Therefore, **if anyone** is in Christ, **he is a new creation**. The old has passed away; behold, the new has come.

**NEW CREATION – God makes us new in Christ!**



# In Christ We Are Reconciled to God

<sup>18</sup> All this is from God, who through Christ **reconciled us to himself** and gave us the ministry of reconciliation; <sup>19</sup> that is, in Christ God was reconciling the world to himself, not counting their trespasses against them, and entrusting to us the message of reconciliation.

We are reconciled to God – brought back into relationship
